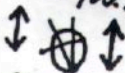

is murdered!



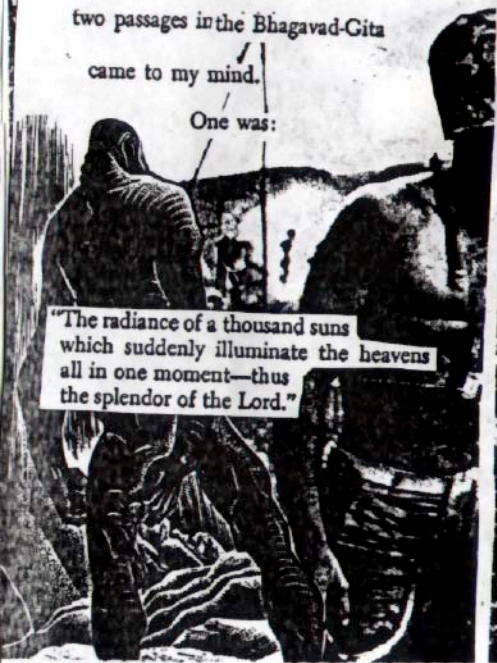
When I saw that ball of fire,


two passages in the Bhagavad-Gita
